

Preserving the Birthplace of Jimmy Stewart





Nearly 60% of residents surveyed feel Indiana County's **best feature is its small town atmosphere**. LandChoices' philosophy of smart conservation design has been an invaluable resource, providing excellent diagrams, information, and tools to help strengthen our new Comprehensive Plan, which encourages growth that balances economic development with protection of natural resources.
